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Prof. Ing. Martin Hanel, Ph.D. is a hydrologist and environmental scientist specializing in climate change impacts on water resources, statistical hydrology, and climatology. He serves as Vice-Rector for International Relations at the Czech University of Life Sciences Prague and is a Full Professor at the Faculty of Environmental Sciences, where he leads the Department of Water Resources and Environmental Modelling and the Hydrological and Climate Variability research group.

He has extensive international research experience, including work at the Royal Netherlands Meteorological Institute. His research focuses on extreme hydrological events, drought analysis, and climate adaptation strategies, with an emphasis on data-driven approaches and environmental modelling.

Prof. Hanel has authored numerous publications in high-impact journals and has led or contributed to major national and international research projects on water systems and climate change. He is actively engaged in strengthening international collaboration in research and education.

Vice-Rector for International and Public Affairs
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Jiří Skládanka is vice-rector for quality and communication at Mendel University in Brno. At the same time, he represents Mendel University in the Council of Higher Educational Institutions, where he is also the statutory vice-chairman. His academic journey began at the Faculty of AgriSciences at Mendel University, where he earned his Master's degree in Animal Husbandry and subsequently a Ph.D. in Special Plant Production. In 2009, he was appointed Associate Professor, and in 2017, he attained the rank of Professor of Special Plant Production. Since 2002, he has been a member of the Department of Animal Nutrition and Forage Production, where he also serves as a supervisor for doctoral programs and a guarantor for the Agricultural Engineering study programs. His specialization is the issue of forage production, forage quality and forage safety, especially for permanent grassland. He completed long-term internships at Justus Liebig University in Giessen, at the Center of Educational and Research Raumberg-Gumpenstein and Kasetsart University in Bangkok. He has visited the United States repeatedly in recent years. In particular, these were trips to the partner Louisiana State University. However, due to Mendel University's interest in deepening cooperation with universities in the United States, he visited NAFSA higher education fairs in Detroit, together with the delegation of the South Moravian Region, as well as the University of Georgia, and the rector's mission of the university in New York and Texas.

He has published dozens of scholarly texts, two books, and coedited two collective monographs. Between 2022 and 2024, he was President of the Czech and Slovak Association for American Studies. Since 2023, he has served as Rector of the University of Ostrava. Starting in August 2025, he has been Vice President of the Czech Rectors' Conference.

Prof. Ing. Libor Čapek, Ph.D.

Rector

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Prof. Ing. Libor Čapek, Ph.D., is a Czech physical chemist and the Rector of the University of Pardubice, a position he has held since February 2022 and continues to hold following reappointments in 2025 and 2026. He graduated from the Faculty of Chemical Technology at the University of Pardubice, where he earned his Master's degree in Technical Analytical and Physical Chemistry in 1998. He completed his doctoral research at the J. Heyrovský Institute of Physical Chemistry and defended his Ph.D. in Physical Chemistry in 2004, receiving the Award of the Ministry of Education for excellent doctoral results.

Prof. Čapek's scientific expertise lies in heterogeneous catalysis and photocatalysis, with emphasis on the study of active centers in catalytic systems and on environmentally relevant catalytic processes. His research includes the development of mixed oxides, layered hydroxides, and TiO₂-based photocatalysts with tailored structural and electronic properties. He became Associate Professor in 2009 and Full Professor in 2017, later serving as Head of the Department of Physical Chemistry and as Vice-Dean and Vice-Rector before assuming the rectorship.

A prolific author in international journals, he continues to contribute to research excellence while shaping the strategic direction of the University of Pardubice.



Prof. Ing. Petra Bajerová, Ph.D.

Vice-Rector for External Relations

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Prof. Ing. Petra Bajerová, Ph.D., is a Czech analytical chemist and professor at the University of Pardubice, where she serves as the Vice-Rector for External Relations and is a long-standing member of the Faculty of Chemical Technology, specifically the Department of Analytical Chemistry. She earned her engineering degree in Technical Analytical and Physical Chemistry in 2002, followed by a Ph.D. in Analytical Chemistry in 2007, both at the University of Pardubice. She completed her habilitation in analytical chemistry in 2015 and was appointed Professor in Food Technology in 2023 by Tomas Bata University in Zlín.

Her research focuses on analytical chemistry, especially classical and green extraction techniques, chromatographic separation, and the chemical profiling of natural and food-based matrices. She has contributed to high-quality publications examining volatile compounds, phenolic profiles, and antimicrobial activities of plant materials.

Prof. Bajerová has also completed several international research stays at Ghent University in Belgium, strengthening her interdisciplinary expertise. She continues to contribute to science, education, and academic leadership at UPCE.

Prof. PhDr. Jan Váně, Ph.D.

Vice-Rector for External Relations

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Prof. Jan Váně is Vice-Rector for External Relations at the University of West Bohemia (UWB) in Pilsen, Czechia. He represents the university leadership in strategic external engagement and in building partnerships with international academic institutions. He is also a member of the Research, Development and Innovation Council of the Government of the Czech Republic (RVVI). During the delegation visit to the United States, he participates in meetings focused on student exchange and international mobility to underscore UWB's institutional commitment and to support the establishment of long-term partnership frameworks at leadership level. Operational aspects of mobility - exchange modalities, procedures, and implementation - are led by UWB's Director of the International Office, who conducts the detailed discussions with partner institutions. Jan Váně is a Professor of Sociology and brings extensive experience in applied research and institutional development. He values international cooperation as a key driver of educational quality, student opportunity, and resilient academic communities.
